





or the Sheets Family, owners of Sheets Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram of Beckley, the automotive industry is a family affair, one that spans two (2) generations. Dennis and Cindy Sheets of 1028 Lake Drive, have lived in Glade Springs for around a year this coming June. The family, who hailed from Bluefield, WV by way of Tazewell, Virginia, made the move in order to

be closer to the family business.

Dennis, is no stranger to the Beckley area, being the Owner and Dealer Principal of Sheets Automotive Group located on Auto Plaza Drive. He has worked in the Beckley area now for 28 years. He has been in the automotive industry since the age of fourteen (14). In true entrepreneur spirit, Dennis worked his way up from washing vehicles at Ramey's in Tazewell, to selling vehicles at age

nineteen (19), to ultimately becoming the General Manager of eight (8) automotive lots. He made his exit from Ramey Motors in 2004 when he and his wife, Cindy, purchased Oak Hill Chrysler Dodge in Oak Hill, WV. In 2010, the family expanded operations acquiring the Beckley Chrysler, Dodge, Jeep and Ram Franchises, and consolidated locations to Beckley where the Sheets Automotive Group remains to this day. Since that time, business has thrived and in 2016 TIME Magazine named Dennis "Dealer of the Year for West Virginia."

In addition to his work at the dealership, Dennis also sits on many boards including: The Dealer

Advisory Board for the West

Virginia DMV, the Truist Community Advisory Board, as well as acting as the Vice Chairman of the Board for the West Virginia Dealers Association.

As for Cindy, she too, possesses quite the impressive entrepreneurial background. Straight out of Bluefield University, where she obtained a degree in Business, and then earned her MBA from Averett University in Danville,

VA, Cindy began working alongside her stepfather, William "Bill" Turner, who made a name for himself as one of the pioneers of cable and satellite television in Welch, WV. Since 1986, Turner had been marketing and selling satellite programming to the C-band satellite industry. In 1989, Cindy joined the team, helping to facilitate the expansion of TurnerVision and developing a Call Center Operation to better serve its customers. In 1993, TurnerVision transferred operations to Bluewell from Welch and was the largest private employer in Mercer County, employing over four hundred (400) individuals. As technology evolved, so did TurnerVision's programming venture, linking up with Superstar/Netlink Group, LLC, a division of TV Guide. When a smaller dish was ultimately introduced in 1999, TurnerVision went on to form a marketing alliance with Echostar Communications Corporation (DISH Network), which converted its 1.4 million existing customers to the new DISH Network. The Bluefield call center was ultimately purchased by DISH Network, who still operates out of Mercer County to this day.

In 1997, Cindy helped create WISDOM Television and Radio, which focused on producing original content for the "mind, body and spirit." Distribution for WISDOM was primarily available through DISH Network and Comcast, though radio content was available on Sirius Satellite Radio. The company was ultimately purchased by Steve Case (founder of AOL) in 2005 and rebranded under the name Lime TV. Today, WISDOM now operates under the lifestyle brand GAIAM, with a good number of its original content still available for streaming.

But if you thought this family was all work and no play, you'd be sadly mistaken. The couple loves to travel, and has quite the impressive check list of places they have visited. From the heart of London and the British Isles to the Egyptian pyramids, the Sheets are always ready for adventure. When asked where their favorite destinations lay, Cindy cites the Hawaiian Island Kauai'i, while Dennis named the Cayman Islands, as one of his favorites (as a bonus, it's an easy trip at only 3 hours by plane).

The couple also have a twenty-seven (27) year old daughter, Haley, who is a 2017 graduate of Virginia Tech, where she earned a degree in Business. But much like her parents, Haley too, possesses the entrepreneur spirit. Following graduation, she joined the Sheets team, and works currently at the dealership in Beckley, alongside her father, mother, uncle, cousin and Goldendoodle, Murphy, who is also a fixture at the dealership.

Stateside, the family enjoys spending time outdoors; hiking and boating at Claytor Lake in Virginia, and relaxing on the beach in Pawleys Island, SC where they have second homes to enjoy spending time with friends and family. In 2020, Dennis took a trip to Las Vegas where he went Skydiving— an incredible experience that he would absolutely do again. LAKEN BALL

National champion!

Four years ago, I penned a story for this magazine (then Glade Living) about Laken Ball, who was about to finish her stellar basketball career at Woodrow Wilson and had just signed to take her game to Transylvania University in Lexington, Kentucky. Transy, as it is affectionately called by its students and alumni, is a division III school with outstanding academic offerings, which no doubt was attractive to the soon to graduate Flying Eagle with a goal of an accounting degree as a preliminary to law school, but it was the opportunity to continue playing basketball that really sent her packing to the first university founded in the Bluegrass state. Four years later she walks around campus with her feet barely touching the ground. Laken and her teammates recently captured the Division lll Women's Basketball National Championship in Dallas, Texas, on the home court of the Dallas Mavericks before a national television audience.

My how things have changed, and yet remain the same. She is on track to graduate with her degree in accounting. The LSAT looms with law school afterwards (UK or WVU). But she still has an itch to scratch! The passion I spoke about in that initial story is still there, and winning a national championship has only fueled it. "I'm going to come back for my 5th year (covid)," she recently told me, excited to be able to indulge in her passion for one last time before moving on to a life where she will no doubt be a champion in whatever endeavors she undertakes.

Their path to an undefeated season and ultimately the first national championship in school history was not an easy one. The Pioneers had to fly to Connecticut to play Smith College in the semifinals a full two weeks before the final in Dallas. Their opponents had a one-



hour bus ride to the contest where they played in front 3,000 of their fans. Transy prevailed anyway 76-65. Laken battled foul trouble but contributed 13 points, 3 rebounds, and an assist. Prior to that semi victory they had beaten Milikin and then Ohio Northern to advance to the Elite 8. Laken racked up 16 pts and 4 rebounds against ONU. They next knocked off NYU 79-63 to set up the game with Smith.

The week in Dallas was a whirlwind, but one she will treasure. "Coach gave us some time off after the semis. Then we had a hard week of practice and film study, mostly working to beat their full court pressure. We played 5 vs 12 all week to get used to their press. In Dallas we got one day of practice on the Mavs court and then practiced at SMU." Their send off from Lexington included good wishes and inspiration from the mayor of Lexington, as well as several professors, and a cheering crowd.

One of the most memorable events was the all-team banquet with all the teams from all the divisions present. 2023 was only the second time the NCAA had held all three division championship games in the same location. Laken enjoyed meeting players from all the other teams and just getting into the arena before the big game was special. "We had to dress up because we had to walk the red carpet into the arena. It really drove the point home about how special this was." One of the perks of winning the Dlll title was getting to hold the flag during the national anthem at the Dl championship game between LSU and Iowa.

Many local fans were tuned into the game and got to see Laken ice the win with 2 free throws with time running out. They also saw her photobomb her coach on national TV

> while she was being interviewed after the game. "That whole celebration was just a blur! We were so excited. When we were about to get our pictures taken, I had to get cleaned up by our trainer. Both my knees were bleeding, and I couldn't tell you how that happened!"

"My biggest takeaway from that whole experience was how fulfilling it was to see so many fans watching women's basketball. It is wonderful to have been part of that growth in the game," she muses. Meanwhile her own game has matured since her days running up and down local courts. "I shoot a lot more threes these days and just have a better understanding of how to play the game the right way. There is so much more detail at this level." She says all her teammates were the best players on their high school teams so naturally my game had to grow. "Coach Nabors (WWHS) gave me a great foundation. I owe him a lot," she said gratefully...still grounded and humble, even when walking on air after an undefeated season (33-0) and a national title!

Friends Of Coal Ladies Auxiliary Made Up of Giving Hearts

Regina Fairchild and her many associates in the Friends of Coal Ladies Auxiliary have giving hearts, and those hearts beat especially fast when they are immersed in one of their many service projects. "We've been around for years and will celebrate our 18th birthday August 7," she

said recently while in the middle of preparations for one of their biggest fund raisers of the year, the annual Friends of Coal Golf Tournament to be held on The Cobb Course on Friday, June 16th. All the proceeds from this year's event benefit the FOCLA scholarship fund established through the Beckley Area Foundation with the goal being to provide even more financial aid to area graduates in the future. This past year FOCLA awarded \$20,000 in scholarships to 24 graduating seniors across eleven West Virginia counties. Applications can be made through any high schools' guidance counselor.

This is their tenth year sponsoring the popular golf tournament. The first was held at the now defunct White Oak Golf Club in Oak Hill. Since that inaugural outing, all the courses at Glade Springs have hosted the Captain's Choice

FOC was founded nearly 30 years ago, the brainchild of Warren Hylton, who according to Fairchild, wanted the story known of how coal and the coal industry "touches everyone."





Initially that was also the mission of the Ladies Auxiliary: to teach prospective members how coal affects and has affected so many throughout southern WV and throughout the world. That is still part of the mission, but so is making the lives of so many in our communities better, through their Giving Hearts programs.

The Ladies Auxiliary got its start when she invited 100 ladies to a luncheon which she hosted in her home. "They were from all walks of life: bankers, realtors, educators, retailers, you name it, I invited them." And they came and they were fed, not just a great lunch, but education as to how vital coal is and has been to all of them for generations. Most stayed and the organization hit the ground running.

Through their "Giving Hearts" program they work all year long through local school guidance counselors to assist displaced families who may have lost their homes due to fire or eviction. At Christmas they provide many area families with a two-weeks supply of food as well as 3 new toys for each child in the home. They also provide coats and clothing, pajamas, and new outfits for school aged children. GH looks especially to be helpful to deployed military families, which coincides with the work they do at the Beckley VA. As a result of members of the auxiliary volunteering to help with the Dream Tree at The Greenbrier, "Giving Hearts" gets access to many new toys which go to these distressed families. They also are aligned with the National Fraternal Order of Police which results in over 800 new toys each year to support this program.

The Ladies Auxiliary redecorated the 4th floor at the Beckley VA. Many of the vets who reside there permanently also worked in the coal industry, so they requested their floor have a coal mining theme. The ladies were only too happy to oblige. They also help fund the veterans' daycare programing, and when they found out many of the vets wanted to engage in bread making, they were Johnny on the spot to provide the necessary materials for those activities. They also fund the monthly birthday celebrations that are held for veterans on the Beckley campus.

One of the auxiliary's earliest initiatives was Coal in the Classroom. Currently this educational program is offered at St. Francis and St. Peter and Paul elementary schools (third grade) where it runs for 6 weeks, usually in the spring. Every student is provided with a workbook. The program is overseen by auxiliary members who are retired educators, and each week a special guest focuses on a topic ranging from how coal is mined underground to how surface mining is accomplished while keeping miners and the environment safe. There are lessons on coal washing, diamond formation, fossil formation, and how products made from coal touch all our lives. Intertwined with these lessons about the science of coal are lessons in spelling, math, history, geography, and geology. The program culminates each spring with a field trip to the Beckley Exhibition Coal Mine. Fairchild says she hopes they can get approved to offer the program in public schools in the future.

There the children enter the mine through the FOC loading dock, a now completely enclosed large foyer that was funded through coal company donations to a program headed by the Ladies Auxiliary. The total cost was just over \$100, 000 and now provides all visitors with an educational, safe, and clean entrance to the mine.

Another of their ongoing projects is maintaining a closet at several local schools (WWHS and Mabscott Elementary). The closets are full of clothing that school personnel can access for children whenever they see a need.





These busy ladies also run an online store whose proceeds fund their many projects. Shoppers can visit the Friends of Coal website and then click on **Shop**. There they will find products ranging from golf apparel and golf bags, jackets, BQ accessories, stainless steel trailer hitches, to luggage.

The next time you read about a Friends of Coal Ladies Auxiliary event, know that it is being staged by some hardworking ladies whose giving hearts are not working on their own behalf, but in service to others.

HOME BREW!

In 1979, President Jimmy Carter signed into law a bill legalizing the home brewing of beer, making him an American homebrew hero, in spite of being a teetotaler. A group of Glade Springs residents has been taking advantage of this law and brewing their own beer for over fifteen years. Back then, craft beer was becoming popular, but southern West Virginia didn't have any craft breweries. Now we have seven craft breweries around Beckley less than an hour's drive away.

Our group brews beer on a five-gallon scale in our garages, and this gives us about two cases of beer. That's not a lot of beer for all the work when we divide it among the group, but we have a good time brewing. Charlie Papazian, the father of American home brewing, says about the home brewing process-- "Relax. Don't worry. Have a homebrew."

Beer is normally made from four ingredients: water, fermentable sugars, hops, and yeast. The sugars are extracted from malted barley with water and boiled with hops. The resulting mixture is then cooled to room temperature or lower. Yeast is added to ferment the sugars to alcohol and carbon dioxide. After fermentation is complete (normally a week to a few months, depending on the beer style), the beer is bottled with a small amount of added sugar. This sugar is fermented, giving the bottled beer its carbonation.

We have made a variety of ales and lagers over the years, including pilsners, Octoberfests, Kolschs, cream ales, pale ales, India Pale Ales (IPAs), brown ales, Irish red ales, barley wines, a Belgian triple, porters, and stouts.

EQUIPMENT AND INGREDIENTS

- 5 or 6 Gallon Pot
- Boiling Plate like you would use for a turkey fryer with propane hookup

- A Home Brewing Kit from a Premium Home Brewer such as NorthernBrewer.com
- Sugar
- $\bullet \ {\rm Bottles}$
- + 5 or 6 Gallon Plastic Bucket with Lid and Airlock
- Ice or Copper Cooling Coil

DIRECTIONS


 Pour Malt Extract from your kit to the 5/6 gallon bucket with water according to directions with the Hops and boil for 1 hour
 After an hour of boiling, cool the "Wort" as quickly as possible using a cooler with ice or a copper cooling coil
 When the Wort has reached room temperature or below, pour into your 5/6 gallon plastic bucket

4. Add Brewers Yeast from Kit to start the fermentation process5. Ferment for 1 week to several months depending upon the strength and style of beer you are brewing

- 6. Pour off the beer from the sediment
- 7. Add a small amount of sugar to carbonate the beer
- 8. You're ready for bottling!

Additionally, hiking improves our body's proprioception, the ability to sense its location, movements, and actions.

• Promoting quality sleep: Hiking increases our daytime body temperature by as much as two degrees. Thus, when hikers lay down to sleep at night, their bodies experience a more significant temperature drop, cooling down more efficiently for deep, restful sleep.

• Building bone density: High bone density is crucial for preventing bone breaks and reducing our risk of osteoporosis. Since hiking is a weightbearing activity — even more so when carrying a pack — this pursuit actively strengthens bone tissue, especially in the legs and trunk.

Psychologically speaking, spending time in nature (especially combined with serotonin-boosting sunshine) combats symptoms of stress, depression and anxiety, allowing us to temporarily disconnect from the pressures of "real life." This sensory immersion also fosters inventive problem-solving and inspires gratitude for the beauty of the natural world. Make the most of the upcoming sunny summer days by taking a hike ... for your health!




Mars may seem a long way from Beckley, but it was an important stop for a local home loan expert who has now come full circle.

W hen pharmacists Leslie Sisson and Amy Jamison left Rite-Aid to start their own pharmacy in January of 2020, they did so hoping to use all the knowledge they had gained working for the giant chain pharmacy but with the freedom to serve their customers with a more caring, personal touch that just the sheer size of such a chain precluded. The goal was to become an integral part of the Shady and Glade communities while providing their neighbors a vital service. What they did not foresee (not that anyone did) was a pandemic and how it would affect the conduct of business or how it would curtail personal and social interactions.

It was not an ideal climate for launching a new enterprise, especially one they hoped would hinge on a "personal touch." Covid took away all of that, but it could not take away the resolve of these two entrepreneurs. Instead of throwing up their hands, they doubled down and went to work informing the public of the services they could offer.

They reached out to former patients via phone calls,



mass mailings, radio and TV commercials, and of course social media (Facebook). Once schools reopened, they advertised on school sports calendars, bingo fundraisers at local schools, and through announcements via the PA at football games. Signage at the store location adjacent to Perry Memorial United Methodist Church didn't hurt either. It

took a while and a healthier country, but their efforts have borne fruit, and Shady Spring Pharmacy has established itself as the "go to" pharmacy for those living along route 19 in this end of Raleigh County. The traffic on 19 is brutal at times and with the new Z-way construction soon to begin in earnest, Sisson thinks they are positioned perfectly. "It already is a lot more convenient to drive in our direction than all the way into town or even Beaver," she noted.

The convenience of a drive through coupled with cost savings and competitive prices (their prices match those of Good Rx for anyone who isn't covered), veteran discounts, and that personal touch have created a winning formula for the pharmacy as well as their customers. "We often serve as an intermediary between our customers and their physicians," Jamison said. "Luckily, I was raised on a farm because when I was dropping off a rural customer's meds, I stepped up on the porch to knock on the door, I was besieged by every manner of critter: chickens, roosters, guineas. They had already gone to roost and raised quite a ruckus."

With a great selection of greeting cards, the shop has rescued many customers on their commute home who have forgotten an important date. They can save the day at SSP and pick up an appropriate card and thoughtful gift.



My experiences this past February traveling across Florida visiting Glade friends and neighbors taught me something I hadn't considered prior.
