
Remember, your shoeboxes will be given to children throughout the world, many of whom have never received a gift before.

SPARTAN RACER

At the confluence of competition and good health (fitness), you will find Wes Duncan standing proudly, perhaps bent over, looking a bit winded, even post-race a little ragged, but ultimately happy and unbowed. Duncan recently completed his second Spartan Race at The Summit, competing in the super division that calls for all participants to conquer 6 miles of challenges over a course whose elevation rises and falls 2,200 feet through the rugged West Virginia countryside.

How he got there is another story altogether. Once an outstanding basketball player and now avid golfer suffering from a bad back, Duncan sought relief first through medicine. Doctors at the WVU Spine Center told him he needed to avoid high-impact sports (basketball) and if he intended to continue to golf that he would have to get fit

and strengthen his core. He joined a small group of hard workers training under the watchful eye of Matt Morris. While getting fit, he lost 22 pounds, but after a while, the workouts became stale. As a group, they decided to try a Spartan Race, knowing that the competition would stir their juices and keep workouts fresh. In 2018, after a year of training, he completed his first Spartan Race at The Summit. Recently he completed his second one.

"It's the hardest athletic event I've ever attempted," he says. "Nothing else is even close. It's downright painful." Duncan admits he wasn't as well trained this time around and had to pace himself at times. He also recruited golf buddy Adam Perry, who had been competing in marathons and triathlons recently, to go along as a teammate since his





previous training buddies said this year's event didn't fit their schedules. Why, one might wonder, would he then subject himself to such trials and tribulation? Duncan confesses that every so often, he must feed his own competitive nature and that it was a good opportunity to set a good example while sharing the experience with his daughter, Breiel, who has done four Spartan kids races at The Summit. Duncan sheepishly admits his own suffering would also be a way of limiting the "smack talk" around the breakfast table.


The 25 obstacles are a combination of endurance and strength and cardiovascular health. Among the most challenging were the log carry (50 pounds) over 200 yards through a waist-deep lake, the bell ringer (a rope pull/climb), carrying an awkward 50-pound ball across rugged, sloped terrain. Others that pushed him to the point of dizziness or the brink of quitting were a side-hill bucket (50 pounds) of rocks carry and a hill climb with a 60-pound bag of wet sand. Failure to finish any of the obstacles and participants face a penalty. Turns out they are more like a punishment; for example, 30 burpees.

Sound like fun? Duncan says it has its rewards. "There is a brotherhood among the competitors. People you don't know will stop and help you or offer encouragement when they see you struggling. You also hear some swearing out there, people talking to buckets of rocks, saying stuff like 'You won't beat me, you stupid ..." Funny when you look back on it, he says. Not so funny at the time.

All in all, he says the competition leaves him feeling good about himself, knowing that he has the grit to sustain through the tough times that life is sure to bring because he has pushed himself physically and mentally to the brink of exhaustion without giving up. He also relishes the time shared with his daughter and

knows that not quitting sets the right example. His future might hold another Spartan Race later this fall in Charlotte with some of his State Farm cohorts. Till then, he will continue to train, covering 2 miles four times each week. Best of all, his fitness regimen has allowed him to continue to play golf.







Laurie Robinson Sammons is an author, educator and national consultant who trains teachers and administrators in "best practice" instruction in schools across the globe. Laurie spent 21 years in the classroom in North Dakota, five years as a curriculum specialist and adjunct professor of education, and has spent the last 15 years as a consultant. She and her husband, Hank, a retired orthodontist, live eight months of the year in Estero, FL, and from June to October, they are in their home in Glade Springs on Chatham Lake. She says, "We love living in this peaceful gem we call home in the summer months." They enjoy playing golf with friends and taking part in other community events. They both feel that the people here are friendly and inviting.

Working in many countries, Laurie found that teaching educators looks the same wherever you are, and so does attending to the needs of children. Laurie says, "The student population that never left my heart, nor my consciousness, was high-risk students of abuse." She tries to reach that very audience who live a life of sexual abuse, exploitation and human trafficking in her recent book, One Story, Many Voices. Laurie recently shared some of this information at the Glade Community Church, mainly because of the book's connection to the mission and vision of local organization Just For Kids. She passionately says, "Our society is being hit by poisonous arrows today.





Anytime we can rally around advocacy groups like JFK, we should support them in any way that we can."

Laurie goes on to say that we all need to be first responders for those whose voices have been muted from their experiences due to fear and shame. Teachers need to be alert to the signs of unprocessed trauma — signs like blank stares, bullying, inappropriate acting out and social distancing so family secrets are not found out. Here she mentions a past advocacy program called "Stranger Danger," reminding kids to be wary of strangers. That program did not work because 96% of abuse does not come from strangers but from someone known to the abused. These perpetrators groom their subjects, earning their trust and getting to know them. She mentions five basic signs of grooming that, to a trained eye, are easy to identify. First, their target is vulnerable and



accessible, alone, emotional, needy and displaying low self-esteem. Secondly, they build a relationship and establish trust with the target, sometimes in person but often on social media. Next comes the role of filling a personal need, making the target dependent on them by buying gifts, alcohol or drugs, or just befriending them. At the next stage of "grooming," they begin to isolate the target from friends and family so they can take full control,

and then the abuse begins. Laurie mentions that, according to the National Center on Missing and Exploited Children, during the COVID-19 experience (2019-2021), domestic violence and sexual abuse increased 125%!

Lest we become totally disillusioned, Laurie says there is a message of hope, but we can't deny the issues or stand back and do nothing. It's the oft heard "If you see something, say something," or, as



Laurie quotes Dr. Maya Angelou, "To know better is to do better." She lists some pertinent facts:

- One in four females and one in 13 males have been victims.
- The common thread is vulnerability and accessibility.
- Females between 12 and 34 are most often the targets, but some have been victimized as young as age 3.
- Human trafficking is a \$150-billion business.
- The most targeted age is 14.

Laurie says she is often asked why she wants to write these terrible stories that victims tell her. Her answer comes within the words of a beautiful quote by Gibran: "Let us be so connected to one another that when one weeps, the other tastes salt." She says, "If not you and I, then who? Our children need us — they are crying out for attention to be valued and loved. We must be first responders to love and defend our next generation." A compelling Harvard study says that all it takes for a traumatized human to come through his or her circumstances is one solid adult in his or her life.







Do you have gently worn clothes or functional household appliances, furniture, furnishings or electronics that you no


