DAM SOCIAL



Priscilla was left on the tech's grandmother's front porch by a lady named Jochebed. Her uncle wanted to "off" the cat to solve the problem. Just kidding about the lady's name. Not kidding about the uncle and his intentions.

Dr. Hunter called Kathy, suspecting she wanted another cat to complement the pet collection of canines Buddy and Auggie. He was correct! Kathy would stop by a couple of times a month to see Miss Prissy and eventually brought her home, much to the chagrin of daddy Hugh. Hugh thought the pet quota had been fulfilled and was not in favor until night one when M.P. crawled in bed and fell asleep clutching his finger. Game over.

Miss Prissy was adventurous and a hunter. She liked to go off campus and explore the property and stare down deer as well as visit next door with friend Diesel at Dr. Foley's. You had to keep an eye on her at all times.

Fast forward to early May of this year with Kathy and daughter Preston apartment shopping in North Carolina. Home alone, Hugh is putzing around the house outside late in the day when he notices the front door of his exclusive Mountain Laurel Road residence is unlocked and open like the parting of the Red Sea. Miss Prissy is nowhere to be found. Shawshank had been compromised.

Hugh walked around the house and woods about five times to no avail. At some point, he had to make the call you don't want to make and the call you don't want to hear. How do you word this conversation? How do you set it up? "Hey, honey...remember that great honeymoon we had in Paris? Weren't we there about a month or two? ""Hi baby... are you wearing that diamond-encrusted pendant I gave you for our anniversary? "Then ease into the conversation with something like, "by the way, Miss Prissy went over to a friend's house for the evening. I've had a little trouble getting in touch with her, but I'm sure she's fine. Probably out at dinner." Tough conversation all the way around.

What ensued next and over the following 13 days was the biggest man/cat hunt since Ted Kaczynski and Jason Bourne. In fact, those searches paled in comparison and looked like hide-and-seek alongside The Hunt for Miss Prissy. The Farms residents, Phase I, and half of Nextdoor were on the lookout for the Priss. Clearly, she was off the grid.

Slowly, reports came into the Capertons with potential sightings. The Stones on Mt. Laurel, Brenda Meadows, and a lady at Lake Chatham all thought they saw M.P. but could not capture her or get a good enough look to be sure. Candlelit prayer vigils, including her toys, crate, food and flowers, were placed in strategic spots to draw her in, but no Priscilla day after day. Preston even spent a night walking the barn and fields at the Farm with a flashlight, revealing hundreds of eyes of rabbits and who knows what. Again, no Priss.











Lots of reasons to be pessimistic at this point and lose all hope of a happy ending. But low and behold, another sighting near the guard gate and several hours later, on day 13, a malnourished and dehydrated Miss Prissy showed up on the Caperton back porch!

"You could have knocked me over with a feather," says Kathy. "Lots of happy tears!" "She camped out sleeping for three days in the spare bedroom with a little food and water," adds Hugh. "She's not the adventurous type anymore and is happy to just hang around the house and look outside," Hugh says with a laugh.

So back to Shawshank it is for Miss Prissy. Parole denied. And everyone couldn't be happier!

Sauce

- 2 Tbsp olive oil
- 1/2 tsp crushed red pepper flakes
- 3 large cloves garlic, minced
- 1 pint colored cherry tomatoes, sliced in half
- 1/4 cup dry white wine
- $\cdot 1/2$ cup fresh basil, chopped
- 2 Tbsp fresh lemon juice
- \cdot 1/2 tsp fresh lemon zest
- 1/2 tsp salt (taste for more if needed)
- 1/4 tsp fresh ground pepper

White fish (you can use any white fish such as mahi-mahi, cod, or halibut) • 2 Tbsp olive oil

• 11/2 lbs white fish (4 thick fillets 6oz each) · Salt and pepper

Sauce instructions (you can make this in advance if you want to and store it) Heat oil in a large sauté pan over med heat. Add crushed red pepper flakes and garlic and sauté for 1 minute or until garlic is fragrant. Add the cherry tomatoes





and cook, stirring occasionally, until they start to blister but still hold shape, about 9-10

minutes. Add in the white wine, stir, and bring mixture to a gentle simmer. Stir in the basil, lemon juice, lemon zest, salt, sugar, and pepper cook for 2 minutes. Transfer the sauce into a bowl and set aside until needed.

White fish instructions

Heat oil in sauté pan over med heat. Pat the cod dry with paper towels, then season both sides of fish with salt and pepper.

Place cod in the oil and cook until golden brown,

about 3 minutes per side.

Pour the white wine tomato basil sauce over the cod (if you made this ahead of time, re-warm gently), let set for about 1-2 minutes with fish and serve.

You can serve this with rice, potatoes, or simply a salad. It is truly a simple, easy weeknight meal that tastes delicious!

What could come of three girlfriends bonded by a shared sense of curiosity, an interest in true crime, and at times a macabre' sense of humor? If you are a fan of podcasts, you already know the answer. They take their mutual interests and energies and morph into the Cold Case Crew. They aren't "caped crusaders" out fighting crime, but they aren't that far removed from such a comparison as they delve into the many unsolved murders filling the archives of police departments throughout the Mountain State.

Whitney Cappellari, Ashley Hale, and Beth Keatley gather every two weeks to record their podcast as they re-examine all they have learned about some of West Virginia's most salacious and unresolved murders through their extensive research of newspaper



accounts, court records, and discussions with surviving family members and law enforcement. The three amigos do this in an entertaining format that their followers can listen to at their own convenience via Spotify or Apple Podcast using their iPhone, iPod, or laptop. All episodes are on file there and can be listened to in any order should followers have a specific case in which they are interested.

Keatley was inspired by friends in law enforcement who have expressed the need for more manpower to work on local cold cases. It is from this notion that the Cold Case Crew came into inception.

Thus far, they feel that they have made an impact, not just in entertaining their followers but in providing new



hope of resolution for some of the surviving family members. Cappellari says it is very rewarding that some family who has refused to speak to mainstream media have opened up to them. "We are very careful not to say anything that is speculative or that would be upsetting to those who have been dealing with loss for years," she says. Keatley and Hale agree that they are proud that they have proven to be helpful to police who have re-opened some investigations as a result of the information CCC has provided.

I asked each of the girls about the cases they have examined thus far, which was their favorite and/or which was the most troubling. I also wanted to know which case they might be looking forward to exploring. Here are their responses:

Ashley Hale: "My favorite was our first one, Patricia Sue Richmond. We really dug hard on this one, and we continue to speak regularly with family members regarding this one. The most troubling for me is Cherice Gwinn Stevens. We spoke with numerous family and friends and learned there were so many sides to the story. She was a beautiful lady and well known around town. The initial investigation just seemed to stall, and we felt we were so close...like there was just one piece of information right under our noses that would have cracked the case. Very frustrating! I'm looking forward to the WVU coed murders and bringing Mared and Karen's story back to life."


Beth Keatley: "My favorite is Patricia Sue Brogan Richmond. It was our first one, and all three of us had some strange connection to her or someone in her family. We got to know members of both families well and feel like this one will eventually be solved. The most troubling case was that of Theresa Woods. So young when she was murdered, and her family is still struggling with closure. This one is probably the closest to being solved. All three of us had crazy nightmares about Theresa while working on her case. I'm looking forward to telling the Danny Casolaro story. So many conspiracy theories about this one. I've gone down the 'rabbit hole' trying to figure this one out! His death took place in Martinsburg, and that is where my parents were living when I was born."

Whitney Cappellari: "My fave was probably Patricia Sue Richmond. We dug really deep on this, our first case, and got really invested. The most troubling...probably Rosina Fazio (1949) or Mad Butcher (1961-64) because so much time has passed and so have many of the witnesses. I'm looking forward to investigating Evelyn Shrewsburg (1974) because it occurred out at Flat Top, a place with which we are all familiar. Our preliminary research has really piqued my interest in this one."

From their comments, you can see these gals are passionate about finding answers to mysteries long since forgotten by the general public but still being asked by friends and loved ones of the victims.

Listen to one of their podcasts, and you will hear the passion, the compassion, and the desire they have to see justice served and peace brought to the many families and friends who have been affected by these unsolved murders here in our own mountains. Following their own investigative instincts, the Cold Case Crew continues to keep these tragic cases alive for law enforcement as well as for the families of victims still seeking closure.

To Nuke or Not to Nuke: Microwave Matters

y home has been microwavefree for over 15 years ... a shock to some visitors who are accustomed to this commonplace kitchen convenience. It started accidentally, when we moved into a house that didn't come with one, and although we cook multiple times daily, we've found the counter space more valuable than the appliance over the years. For some, the ease and simplicity of microwave cooking are incredibly appealing; worries about lost nutrients and radiation keep others away. So, to nuke or not to nuke? That is the question.

Currently, over 90% of U.S. homes have a microwave, deeming it a safe, effective, and highly convenient cooking method. The appeal is obvious: Microwaves heat food much more quickly and efficiently than other

methods — while consuming less energy (and not heating up the entire kitchen in the process!). Microwaves work via radiation by "jiggling" fats, sugars, and water molecules in food so vigorously that they collide, producing a lot of heat very rapidly. Quicker heating with less liquid means foods retain more nutrients, too. Also, compared to old-fashioned sink or fridge thawing, the microwave's speedy "defrost" function is the clear winner.

On the other hand, some home chefs have legitimate concerns about this ubiquitous kitchen tool. While science now bears out that the electromagnetic radiation emitted by microwaves is not harmful — provided your appliance is in safe, working condition — the way in which they are calibrated to heat food (quickly and

all over rather than slowly and from the inside out) can lead to issues with uneven heating. Since microwaves concentrate on heating water molecules (and protein, fat, and starch molecules heat much more slowly), foods cooked in them warm disproportionately, introducing the potential for burns ... and food poisoning. Food must reach a consistent temperature of 165 F throughout to kill off all harmful bacteria, which is harder to accomplish through microwave cooking.

To be on the safe side, experts agree it's a good idea to keep your face at least 1 foot from the microwave while working, avoid using plastics in the microwave, and use the microwave as a tool for reheating rather than cooking as often as possible. With these precautions in mind, happy cooking!
