





Finding Her Place

I arrived at one of the businesses owned by Michelle, The Dish Cafe, and was immediately Greeted with a smile. Not only is her stature striking, but her enthusiasm is also contagious. "I want to transform our community into a place where people want to live," she said, shortly after we sat down.

Michelle grew up in Beckley and is a face known to many, as a business owner and the President of the Beckley-Raleigh County Chamber of Commerce. It's clear in the first five minutes of our conversation, she's exactly where she's supposed to be. "Part of my work at the Chamber is to take those unique assets that we have and really showcase them, so that when travelers are coming through or kids are considering what they're going to do when they start their careers, they think T'm going to stay here and contribute to this economy," she said.

From attending college in Charleston, South Carolina to working in the mountains of Pocahontas County at Snowshoe, Michelle





landed back in her hometown after starting a family. No longer in the heart of Beckley, but she settled close by in Glade Springs. "I have a lot of love for this area. I grew up here. I want to see it flourish; I want my kids to stay here. I don't want to educate our kids and send them away," she said. "I want them to say, 'Hey, where I live is a really cool place'."

In 2013, she opened The Dish with her aunts, Rosy Corley and Beverly Hall, as business partners. Michelle says she opened the restaurant to serve a need - providing fresh, homemade food made with locally sourced ingredients. "Food is foundational to placemaking," she explained.

Placemaking is a term that came up a lot during our interview, the idea of highlighting the many reasons why you would not only want to visit here but put down roots.

Now, her three children, Bella, Dominic and Marco, all work in the family business and are taking on their mom's mission to create a better future for our community. They've even expanded their Daniels location to another restaurant, Uptown Dish, in uptown Beckley. Truly a full circle moment.

Between running two successful restaurants and leading the chamber of commerce, it's hard to believe Michelle has time for anything else. Believe it or not, she does. And how is her free time usually spent? You may already know – running.

If you live in Michelle's neck of the woods, you've likely seen her early in the morning on her daily run, usually smiling and waving as she passes by. One of the many reasons she loves living in Glade– the space to run. "I think sometimes living at







Glade, I have more of an understanding of how cool it really is here because of the people who I talk to who have relocated here from big cities that we sometimes dream about. We have so many residents who have left those places and come to Glade."

Michelle not only loves living here now but has so many fond memories of raising her children in Glade Springs, a place they want to stay and build their own futures. She is a mom first and has passed on her business savvy and entrepreneurial spirit to her kids, who will no doubt carry on with her legacy. With a deep desire to showcase the unique assets of southern West Virginia, it is evident Michelle has found her place.

Ram Asaithambi -Growing Up Glade & Forging Opportunity!

Ram Asaithambi came to Glade Springs as a 4-year-old with his parents, physicians Divya and Ganesh. Years later he was joined by little sister Ria. Soon he will leave Glade as one of the most accomplished scholars, leaders, and athletes to grace the campus at Woodrow Wilson High School and head to Duke University where he will continue his path of making a difference and shaping his world. Don't fret. He's not leaving for good. In fact, he proudly vows to return. "I fully intend to return to the community and state that has shaped me. I am a West Virginian, and I want to come back and make a difference."

While the idea for the title to this piece was suggested by his mother (she gives the Glade environment and its residents great credit for nurturing Ram), and don't mothers always know best? I must caution readers at this point to be wary of looking Ram directly in the eye as I did when he announced unabashedly his love for this place. Behind those dark brown eyes one will see a passion, albeit a zest, for learning, living, and for West Virginia that might sear the eyes of the unsuspecting. I would agree with mom that there was great nurturing, but the fire and desire behind Ram's achievements are innate, instilled from the parenting and home in which he grew up, the examples of successful living he has witnessed, and from his parent's native Indian culture.

I could fill the next few pages with the achievements of this young man, but if you read newspapers, watch tv, or keep track of happenings in Raleigh County on social media, you are already aware of many of his accomplishments. Like the award winning "Wetlands Project" just completed at WWHS that raised \$250K over 4 years to convert what was essentially a duck pond in front of the school into a wetland habitat complete with an outdoor classroom, boardwalks, and trails to be utilized by Woodrow students and teachers, especially science classes, and as an outdoor art studio, or simply as an area to appreciate nature.

Ram maxed out the Woodrow curriculum, completing 11 AP courses, finishing his high school academic career at the top of his class and as an AP Scholar with Distinction. As this piece is being written, he will be competing with his Flying Eagle teammates in the state tennis tournament in Charleston where he goes in as the #3 seed in boys singles and reigning regional champion and will also be a threat to win the doubles championship with his partner, Ethan Shepard, with whom he made it to the championship match in 2024. This year the pair have set their sites on bringing home the gold.

The articulate soon-to-be graduate says some of his fondest memories of high school were made on the tennis court. "Being able to represent my city and school well on the tennis court



is extremely rewarding." He also pays tribute to his favorite player, Rafael Nadal, when he plays by sporting a bandana and the same racquet as his tennis hero. He views sport in much the same way he views life and academics. "You've got to play to the end, and you have to figure out the problem in front of you (your opponent). It's really up to you and you alone! You forge your opportunities wherever you want them. That's just part of being a West Virginian."

Ram Asaithambi will continue the trek to his own future this fall at Duke, where he will begin work on his double major: bio-medical engineering and electrical and computer engineering. He will also minor in machine learning. He also plans to study German. All of this with an eye toward medical school and his goal of following his parents into medicine. He is fascinated with the future of artificial intelligence and how it will be used in the medical field, not to replace doctors, but as a tool to enhance doctors' ability to heal and understand what patients may be experiencing.

The choice of German as a second language was not a frivolous choice. Many medical devices/machines on the cutting edge of medicine today are engineered in Germany. Ram believes being able to speak the same language as the builders of these machines will give him and his patients an advantage when it comes to optimizing treatments.


As his high school days draw to a close, Ram says the relationships he developed at Woodrow with teachers, administrators, and his fellow students will be what he cherishes the most. There is no doubt that Duke is getting a good one who is determined to forge his own opportunities to their fullest potential!

NOT SHORT ON TALENT! GABE SHORT

abe Short loves basketball and has for as long as he can remember. The 6'1" freshman just completed his first year at Shady Spring High School where he played a key role in the Tigers' successful 2025 season. Even though the Tigers were ranked #1 most of the season and made it to the semifinals at the state tournament, the third generation hooper was not satisfied and is already working toward his goal of finishing the 2026 season hoisting a trophy after the final game at the Charleston Civic Center, a scenario that has become commonplace in recent years for the Shady program under Coach Ronnie Olsen.

That success is part of the reason the Edwards Drive resident brought his considerable game from Greater Beckley Christian, where he played middle school basketball for the Crusaders, to one of the dominant AAA programs in West Virginia. He is the third Short to play for a storied coach, and so



the adage that apples don't fall far from the tree certainly holds true for the Short family. Proud grandfather Pete, who lives on Barnstaple, played for legendary Oceana coach Paul Grier. Dad PJ also played at Oceana for the firey Jim Hopkins before transferring to Logan to star for Coach Tim Murphy's Wildcats.

Once he got over the initial adjustments it takes to transition from middle school to varsity, Gabe was a steady contributor. "Everyone is as big and as fast as you are," he recalled recently. "Overall, I just had to adjust to the speed of the game at the varsity level." Adjust he did. In fact, his personal highlight of the year had a special sweetness to it because it came against his dad's old school, Logan. It was a big game near the end of the season as the Tigers were positioning themselves for another post-season run. With seconds ticking down at the end of the first half, Gabe



emerged from a scramble for a loose ball near mid-court and had the presence of mind to heave a desperation shot from half-court. The buzzer beater at the end of the half touched nothing but nylon and clearly gave Shady the momentum to turn a closely contested game into a route in the second half.

When pressed, the humble shooter admits, "Yeah, that was pretty sweet!" But he isn't resting on those laurels. He's already back in the gym developing his all-around game. A typical day finds him reporting to his grandpa Pete's house after school for some strength and conditioning work. Then it's off to Bryce Radford's basketball academy to get up shots and work on specific things in his game that he wants to improve. The focus for now is on developing his ball-handling, 3-point shooting (adding speed and accuracy to his catch and shoot), and his mid-range game. "I really had to focus on defense this year. Early on my footwork was poor. I had to learn how to be a good on-ball defender," he says pulling no punches in his self- analysis. Radford is not only honing his game, but Gabe says he is almost like a big brother teaching him about more than basketball. Although he is looking forward to his next season, he says he will miss three graduating senior teammates, Khi Olson, Jalen Bailey, and Jack Williams. "Those guys became good friends and were great teammates."

When he looks into his crystal ball, Gabe predicts challenges for AAA supremacy will come from the likes of Nitro, Greenbrier East, Chapmanville, Ripley, and Herbert Hoover but feels Shady's young nucleus of himself, Eli Sexton, Cutter Boggs (both of whom our readers have read about recently), and an influx of middle school talent will steel Shady for the challenges ahead.

Gabe wants to eventually have an all-around game like his favorite player, Luka Doncic, but feels LeBron James might be the GOAT. Coincidentally, both perform for his favorite pro team, the Lakers. When pressed, he admits he also has a soft spot in his heart for the Timberwolves, but when it comes to college hoops his heart is totally Carolina blue.

It might sound like Gabe Short has a one-track mind, but it is only because he loves the game. Working at basketball for him just means having fun and living his dream. All of which he hopes, one day, will lead to fulfilling his long-term goal of playing at the next level. When that happens, none of his coaches, mentors, family, or this writer will be the least bit surprised because this focused young gun is not short on talent or work ethic.





Karen Greeted me at her home holding her dog, CoCo, who stayed with us for most of our conversation. She is modest and down to earth, despite being a woman in a powerful position

to make a difference. And that's exactly what she's doing as a professor at New River Community and Technical College. "You don't have to come from a background from people who are all educated in your family," she said, on leading by example as a first-generation college student.

Karen has been teaching psychology classes at NRCTC since its inception, for more than 20 years. Previously she had a career in behavior management and provided counseling for abused children at FMRS. "I have more autonomy now to make a difference than I did before," she explained, referring to the hefty restrictions CPS places on mental health providers.

Karen studied at WVU for her undergraduate degree in psychology and completed two master's degrees, the first from Marshall University in psychology and the second from Capella University in Industrial Organizational Psychology.

In her current role as a professor at NRCTC, Karen is making a difference in the lives of her students by inspiring them to achieve whatever they're setting out to do. "We have

a lot of first-generation college students, who are very unsure of the whole collegiate environment. I was the first one to go away to college in my family, so I can empathize with them," she said.

She currently teaches nine classes for around 200 students, including general psychology, lifespan human development, and psychology of women. Her favorite class to teach is general psychology, she says, because she gets to debunk a lot of myths about psychology. "Psychology is not all mental health. One of my master's degrees deals with psychology in the workplace, looking at employee motivation and psychological traits that fit certain jobs," she explained.

And Karen uses that exact concept to help guide her students when making big decisions about their chosen career path. "I try to keep up on things at the forefront to teach them," she said. "I teach them about their personality characteristics and how that connects to what might be a good career fit for you."

In addition to teaching, Karen serves as the Faculty Senate Chair and the faculty liaison to the state legislature, keeping up with the laws that could impact higher education. Next semester, however, she is stepping back from those positions to take a much-needed reprieve.

She'll still be in the classroom, though, inspiring students and of course, making a difference.

Ingrid's Cheesecake!

My mountain man's all-time favorite and as always, he had to grate the carrots!

Here's our go-to recipe for a Classic Carrot Cake with Lemon-Scented Cream Cheese Frosting-rich, moist, and made from scratch with love.

CAKE INGREDIENTS

- 2 cups unbleached all-purpose flour
- 2 teaspoons baking powder
- 1 teaspoon ground cinnamon
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 1/2 cup granulated sugar
- 1 stick (1/2 cup) unsalted butter, softened
- 1 teaspoon pure vanilla extract
- 4 large eggs, room temperature, separated
- 3 cups grated carrots (grated by the mountain man!)
- 1 cup walnuts, roughly chopped (baked, not toasted)
- 3-4 tablespoons whipped cream or half-and-half

FROSTING INGREDIENTS

- 1 (8 oz) package cream cheese, softened
- 1 stick (1/2 cup) butter, softened
- 1/2 teaspoon vanilla extract
- 1 cup confectioners' sugar
- Zest of 1 lemon
- Juice of 1/2 lemon

INSTRUCTIONS

For the Cake:

- **1.** Preheat oven to 350°F. Butter a 10-inch round baking pan.
- **2.** In a medium bowl, whisk together flour, baking powder, cinnamon, and salt.
- **3.** In a large bowl, beat butter, sugar, and vanilla until light and fluffy. Add egg yolks one at a time, beating well after each.
- 4. In another bowl, beat egg whites until stiff peaks form.
- **5.** Gently fold the dry ingredients into the butter mixture, alternating with the whipped cream.
- **6.** Fold in the beaten egg whites until no streaks remain.
- 7. Stir in grated carrots and walnuts.
- **8.** Pour into the prepared pan and bake for about 50 minutes, or until a toothpick inserted comes out with a few moist crumbs.
- 9. Cool completely on a wire rack.







For the Frosting:

- 1. Beat cream cheese, butter, and vanilla until smooth.
- **2.** Gradually add confectioners' sugar and beat until light and fluffy.
- **3.** Fold in lemon zest and juice to taste.

To Assemble:

- **1.** Once the cake is completely cool, slice it horizontally into
- **2.** Spread frosting between the layers and over the entire cake. Pro Tip: Don't overmix after adding the dry ingredients—and pull the cake from the oven while it's still slightly moist in the center for that perfect tender crumb.

Final Touches:

- **1.** Chill the frosted cake for 20–30 minutes before slicing to help the frosting set.
- **2.** Garnish with a sprinkle of lemon zest or a few walnut pieces, if desired.

Storage Tip:

Refrigerate leftovers in an airtight container for up to 4 days—if it lasts that long!

It's easy to push off thinking about your health care needs later in life. But the reality is, as we age, many of us will require help with daily activities, and traditional health insurance doesn't cover this. Long-term care insurance (LTCI) can protect your savings, but the decision to buy coverage requires careful consideration.

What to know about LTCI

Long-term care refers to the services people need when they can no longer complete daily tasks due to a chronic illness, disability or cognitive condition like Alzheimer's. This type of care is typically not covered by regular health insurance or Medicare. Over 70% of people over age 65 will eventually require some form of long-term care, often for years. Without LTCI, many must deplete their savings or rely on Medicaid, which has strict asset limits.

What LTCI covers (and doesn't)

LTCI is designed to help cover the cost of daily living support when you can no longer perform at least two of the six activities of daily living: bathing, dressing, eating, toileting, transferring and continence care. It generally pays for services such as nursing homes, assisted living and skilled nursing care — but not for routine medical treatment, which is covered by standard health insurance.

Why timing matters

Timing is everything when purchasing LTCI. The sweet spot is typically between the mid-50s and mid-60s — a stage when many people are still healthy enough to qualify for coverage but not yet facing the higher premiums that come with age. Delaying too long can increase the risk of health issues, making securing a policy difficult or even impossible.

Tax breaks may apply

LTCI may also offer tax advantages. Premiums can qualify as medical expenses and may be deductible for those who itemize deductions. The allowable deduction increases with age; for example, in 2025, a 60-year-old could deduct up to \$1,790 in premiums, while someone over 70 could deduct up to \$5,880.

Making smart coverage decisions

Ultimately, the decision to purchase LTCI depends on individual economic, health and caregiving goals. For those concerned about the potential cost of long-term care, insurance can provide peace of mind and financial protection. However, limited savings or advancing age may make other options, such as Medicaid planning, more realistic.



tepping into the hush of a sun-dappled forest, surrounded by birdsong and the scent of pine — it sounds like something out of a dream. But forest bathing, or shinrin-yoku, is a research-backed practice helping people slow down, feel better and reconnect with Mother Nature. Originating in Japan in the 1980s as a public health response to rising stress and burnout, forest bathing has gained global appeal as both a healing modality and a mindful ritual.

Backed by science

The benefits go far beyond mood. Dozens of peer-reviewed studies show that time spent in natural environments. especially forested ones, can lower cortisol levels, decrease heart rate and blood pressure, reduce anxiety and even enhance immune function by increasing natural killer cell activity. Researchers credit not just the calming sights and sounds of the forest but also exposure to phytoncides, essential oils released by trees that support immunity and well-being.

The art of presence

Forest bathing offers a low-tech antidote to digital fatigue. There's no need to track steps, chart progress or reach a

destination. Instead, find a quiet patch of green and let yourself wander. Run your fingers along rough bark or velvety moss. Listen for the call of birds or the rustle of movement in the underbrush. The goal isn't mileage; it's immersion. Let your senses guide you and your attention settle wherever it naturally lingers.



Forest bathing resonates with a modern audience seeking tech-free time, improved mental health and more meaningful ways to unplug. With no special gear required and no goal beyond presence, the practice fits easily into busy lifestyles and a wide range of physical abilities. It's self-care — but quieter, and possibly with dirt under your nails.



A FOREST OF ONE'S OWN

You don't need a forest to practice forest bathing — it can be adapted to a park, garden or even your own backyard.

- Visit a local park or botanical garden (the greener, the better).
 - · Pause often and breathe deeply.
 - · Sit under a tree with your eyes closed.
 - Add essential oils like cypress or cedar to your diffuser.
 - · Bring home a bundle of eucalyptus or pine.
 - Stroll barefoot through grass or sand.*

*This practice, called "grounding," involves making direct physical contact with the Earth's surface.










A little prep now ensures your biggest worry this summer vacation is whether you packed enough sunscreen.

he bags are nearly packed, the itinerary's set — but before locking the front door, a few simple steps can help protect what's left behind. From lowering energy bills to preventing mishaps and break-ins, a well-prepped home makes it easier to truly unwind while away.

Tame the thermostat

Raise the thermostat a few degrees (around 85°F) while traveling to conserve energy without compromising indoor safety. If pets or houseplants are staying behind, adjust accordingly. Smart thermostats make this even easier, allowing temperature management from afar — and even restoring comfort before you walk back through the door.

Unplug and protect
