playing basketball or pickleball at the Leisure Center with friends.



Chuck Myslinsky

Anyone frequenting Performance Fitness Center can usually find Chuck Myslinsky in one of three places: seemingly going up and down endlessly on the chin up bar, sitting next to said bar catching his breath, or trudging relentlessly uphill on one of the facility's treadmills. It is a fitness regimen as original and unique to the man as his first workouts as a youth when he inserted pieces of wood into cinder blocks to simulate barbells. Later, he would find his first real set of weights, the plastic ones filled with sand, under the family Christmas tree.

It started him down the path of lifetime fitness which he says today has a pretty simple goal. "Just trying to stay healthy," he understates with a smile as bright as a West Virginia moon. His workout motto is just as succinct. "Just trying to survive and advance," he chuckles.

The retired microbiologist/medical technologist who was famously known at the Beckley VA as the "lab daddy" makes the trek to Performance five days per week. There he does 80 chin ups and 50 dips daily, but that is just the tip of his training iceberg. Soon thereafter, he and his

wife of 24 years, Ann Lilly, take their 10-year-old German shepherd Nick and sometimes their neighbor's dog Lily on a hike from their Far Country home to the Small Talk Café. It's a roughly 5-mile jaunt, and when coupled with his 13- minute-mile on the treadmill at Performance (at maximum incline) takes care of his daily cardio.

Growing up in Toronto, Ohio, Chuck laughs about how he developed healthy cardio habits as a youth. "We didn't have a car so anytime I wanted to go somewhere it was either walk, run, or ride my bike. I was like Forrest Gump before





Forrest Gump." His first real job was at a steel mill in Steubenville, a 10-mile bike ride away.

Back in their Far Country home, the affable senior isn't done with keeping his guns toned. During the course of a normal day, he does 200 pushups and 200 ab wheel crunches, knocking them off in varying increments during breaks from watching the stock market on his computer.

Chuck summarizes his diet simply, "I'm a grazer. I graze all day long...just little, tiny snacks, veggies, leftovers. Maybe an occasional chunk of brownie or chicken." He isn't a big water drinker either. "Coffee. Black and it better be bold." He says he and Ann drink it all day right up until bedtime. "We just have one rule. If you drink the last cup, you make a fresh pot."

Next time you see him out, you might ask him to demonstrate his "static pushup." It's no simple feat. You lie flat on the floor with arms and legs extended as far as possible and then using just your core muscles, somehow magically pull yourself up into the pushup position. Once you see it, you might want to subscribe to the Myslinsky philosophy of "never lifting more than your own body weight." It has worked wonders for Glade's Chin Up Man, keeping him fit, full of good humor, and ready for his next challenge.


To make the space even more kid friendly, they've converted the office to a playroom and the dining room into another sitting area, with a couch and space for entertaining.





If you happen to spot Teddy and Annie cruising through Glade or basking in the sun at home, don't hesitate to say hello to these lovable Goldendoodles!



Speech pathologist called to service

hen Hollie Williams headed off to Marshall University, the former Woodrow Wilson cheerleader already knew she wanted to live a life of service, she just thought it was going to happen as a nurse and eventually as a nurse anesthetist. Her path to service changed abruptly when she was invited by her roommate to observe one of her sessions as a speech pathologist.

"I just fell in love with the whole dynamic immediately," she recalls. "It was the perfect application for my favorite subjects, philosophy and science." The capper was the personal interaction with someone yearning to improve their ability to speak and communicate. "It is an amazing moment when kids get it, when they overcome something structurally impeding their speech. To see their confidence soar and the satisfaction they feel is just amazing," the Glade resident says.

She began working in the Raleigh County school system at now defunct Soak Creek School. "It was a great little school," she remembers fondly. "The relationships with the kids there were so strong just because of the numbers."



Now at Shady Elementary, she says those same relationships are key to the successes of her students.


Mrs. Williams sees roughly 50 students weekly. That's 50 different IEPs (individual lesson plans) which could be overwhelming to someone not vested in their students' success like Mrs. Williams. She says an articulation disorder has no connection to a student's intellectual abilities, but it can affect self-esteem and confidence. "Often it is just a matter of trial and error to find a solution," she says. "Patience and persistence are just as important as the methods we employ."

Williams is a bit of an anomaly, a teacher who loves her extra duties (morning, lunch, and bus). "Morning duty gives me a chance to greet each of my students at the beginning of each day, just making sure they feel welcomed and valued is so important in building a working relationship." Bus duty allows her to send students home with a positive vibe. Whenever she sees her students outside her classroom, she likes to engage them in ways that require them to respond by exercising the speech patterns they have been working on in class. "It just reinforces the effort we are making together in class." Williams is convinced that verbal affirmation is paramount in letting kids know their teachers really care. She has witnessed how that caring is often key to solving a particular articulation problem, like one of the most prevalent issues: the inability to say the letter "R" correctly.



Williams admits that she is quite animated when she is teaching. "Lots of hugs and pats on the back." She has been a firsthand witness to the effects of opioids on her students, especially foster kids whose parents were involved with drugs. "Those children have a decrease in working memory and might require hearing something hundreds of times before they get it."

That animation and a willingness to help others is what led to her participation in the 2014 edition of Dancing With The Stars for the United Way of Southern West Virginia. She was paired with local attorney Chip Williams. Through the process of learning to dance together, they fell in love. "My parents begged me not to date him until the contest was over. I think they worried that if



Cumin Chimichurri Skirt Steak with Avacado Charred Corn Salad

This is a really ease weeknight recipe. You could even make the avocado and charred corn salad a day ahead of time if you wanted to. I sometime will use frozen corn for the corn on the cob a just microwave until warm. Also, I will make double and even triple of the chimichurri sauce because this is so good to drizzle on the meat after it comes off the grill and to put a some about on the avocado and charred corn salad too. For the Thai chili you can use dried and put as much or as little as you like in the chimichurri. You will need to taste your chimichurri sauce as you make it to adjust the salt, cilantro and lemon. If it tastes right to you then it's done. I will sometimes make this ahead of time and just set on counter till needed. The Avocado and charred corn salad like to eat at room temp or cold. I do grill the steak for about 2-3 min on each side depending on how thin the steak is. Make sure you trim some the fat off your steak (sometimes it's not trimmed well at the store). I usually find this type of cut of skirt steak at Sam's. I will also salt and pepper the meat and add a sprinkle of cumin also about 1-2 hrs. before cooking. If you have a grill pan you could also use this to cook the Steak over the stove. I hope you enjoy.

INGREDIENTS

- Skirt Steak (dependent on number of servings)
- · Salt and pepper
- Cumin (1-2 tsp)
- Sweet potatoes 2-4 (dependent on number of servings)
- Avocado 1-2 (dependent on number of servings)
- Corn on the cob 2-4 (dependent on number of servings)
- Red onion 1-2 (dependent on number of servings)
- Garlic 2-4 (dependent on number of servings)
- Thai chili (to taste. may use substitute for this what ever you have on hand, I used 1 dried Thai chili)
- · Cilantro 1-2 bunches
- 1-2 Lemons (dependent on number of servings)
- 1-2 limes (dependent on number of servings)
- Heirloom grape tomatoes 4-8oz (dependent on number of servings)
- · Olive oil



DIRECTIONS

1. Make chimichurri, mix chopped cilantro about 2-3 tablespoons or to taste (remember you may want to make extra for salad and serving on the side), ½ -2 tsp cumin (I like the taste of cumin so I usually will add extra to taste, 3-4 tbsp olive oil, garlic minced, and chili (to taste, and

squeeze of lemon. Once mixed taste and add salt and pepper to taste. Sometimes I will add more of the other ingredients depending on taste. Set aside, like I said a lot of times I will make this 1-2 days ahead of time. 2. Preheat oven to 425 and wash and dry all produce, bring steak to room temp (I have already added salt, pepper, and some cumin 1-2 hrs prior and placed steak in the frig until I'm ready to start prep of other ingredients). Peel sweet potatoes and cut in cubes about 1/2in. If using corn on the cob cut corn kernels from the cob (or you could roast whole on the grill the cut kernels off). Halve and peel onion cut into quarters. Mince garlic and chili (can remove the ribs and seeds of chili for less heat if using fresh chili). Finely chop cilantro and halve lemon, lime, and tomatoes. 3. Roast sweet potatoes tossed in oil and add a large pinch of salt and pepper. Roast until browned for about 20-25 min toss intermittently during roasting. Also, in a separate pan roast onion and corn, drizzle with oil, salt and pepper prior to placing in oven. You will want to get a little char on you onions and corn (this is why I prefer to do this part on a grill). 4. Once your ingredients are done for the salad, slice avocado in cubes and toss with corn, onion, sweet potatoes, cilantro, a squeeze of lime and add a little of the Thai chili that remains to taste. Season with salt and pepper. Here is where I will also add 1-3 tbsp of the chimichurri sauce also.

5. Grill steak to med rare for 2-3 min each side depending on thickness of your meat. Let rest for about 5min then slice thin and drizzle chimichurri liberty over thinly sliced meat.
