ELI SEXTON

Working hard, dreaming big

Since Ronnie Olson took over the basketball program, Shady Spring High School has become a mainstay at the boys' WV State Basketball Tournament staged every year at the Charleston Civic Center. To anyone who has watched the program evolve into what it is today, a state-wide, respected championship program, several things have become evident. If players are going to see the floor for Shady, they must be willing to play hard-nosed, physical, in-your-face defense, and they must be able to win rebounding battles against bigger opponents. It also doesn't hurt if they possess a deft touch from beyond the three-point line and can get defenders back on their heels with hard, downhill drives into the paint. It's a pretty good recipe for success for players and the team.

There is another common thread that winds its way through Olson's teams. If you are good enough to play, you are going to play, and that means freshmen who are willing and able to do those things listed above will get playing time. First came the Chapman twins, the Williams brothers, and eventual state player-of-the-year, Amar Maxwell. All played crucial minutes as freshman, many as starters. This year, freshman Eli Sexton has become one of the Tiger-cubs who has grown into a vital cog in Shady's success.

The son of Rocky and Jessica Sexton (Sherwood Forest) possesses a deft touch from outside the arc. The southpaw credits his dad for his shooting prowess. "Dad put a ball in my hands as soon as I was big enough to hold it." That fatherly support continues today at Integrity Chiropractic, his father's place of business. The high ceilings (once a car dealership) are perfect for a Gun Shooting Machine and hoop that allow Eli to get up as many shots as he wants on any given day, including bad weather days. The facility really came in handy this winter with all the school cancellations due to weather, and the results are obvious. Eli's overall shooting percentage is 43% and his scoring average as the













season winds down is nearly double figures with high games of 15 points against Princeton and Summit Christian.

Sexton cut his teeth playing in the Raleigh County elementary basketball league and playing travel ball for the Wolfpack against many of his current teammates who played for Shady Elite. Having played at Cranberry Elementary where he suffered a broken arm and at Mt. Hope Christian, he has found a home at Shady. "I love the basketball and the school environment as well," the soft-spoken Sexton shared recently. He isn't the only student athlete in the Sexton household. Big sister Shailee is a senior at WWHS where she plays volleyball and softball.

A self-described "gym rat," Eli says when he isn't hoisting up shots, he enjoys working out at the Leisure Center, playing golf, and an occasional video game, Fortnite being his favorite. 

Balancing turf care & budgets

Funny how we remember where we were when world-changing events occur. No matter how mundane the task we might have been mindlessly doing, when asterisked with historical significance by a faraway event, those moments become crystalized in our memories. I was sitting in my last period seventh grade science class when news came that President Kennedy had been shot. Over twenty years ago Keith Honaker, who had worked his way up the ladder at Aspen Golf Division to the lofty title of assistant project manager in charge of irrigation, had spent September 11 from dawn until dusk in the ditches his crew had dug at The Hill

Course in Blacksburg, Virginia, securing fittings and checking for leaks while putting the finishing touches on a project at the city-owned golf course, when a passerby inquired if he knew what had happened that day in New York City, Washington, D.C., and a field in western Pennsylvania.

Honaker was clueless, engrossed that fateful day in the details of his work so that he and his crew could get the project finished in a timely manner. It wasn't long after that tragic day altered our country's history forever that Honaker found his own life direction changing as it wasn't long after that he left Aspen and took the job as the assistant superintendent at The Cobb course. A year later he was elevated to head superintendent thanks to a serendipitous moment in the parking lot at a local grocery store.

Honaker recalled the moment almost wistfully as we sat in his office in the Cobb maintenance building. "I had pulled in on the way home to pick up a few items, and I looked over and there was Ed King, sleeping in his vehicle while his wife was shopping." At the time King, one of the resort's

managing partners, was charged with hiring the next course superintendent for The Cobb. "I walked over and tapped on his car window to awaken him and just told him that I knew I could do the job, and that all of my work with Aspen, my education, and previous experience working at golf courses in the Hilton Head area had prepared me." He was hired on the spot, and 23 years later he is still on the job.

It was the second time they had offered him the job. The reason Honaker didn't take the initial offer serves as a window into his character. He was still working for Aspen at the time and needed several weeks to complete a big and important project. Glade wanted him to quit and begin immediately, but he explained that the Adkins brothers had been so good to him that he couldn't leave them hanging, no matter how badly he wanted the job. Later, a chance meeting in a parking lot would leave both parties happy.

His journey to becoming a superintendent did not follow the usual track. He didn't feel confident about his prepharmacy major and getting into pharmacy school, so he dropped out and went to work at the Pete Dye Course in Bridgeport where his boss held a degree in agronomy from Ohio State. An avid golfer, he liked the work, being outdoors, and began to see a way to make it a career. He went back to WVU and got his degree in agronomy while continuing to work on the maintenance staff at Lakeview Resort.

Upon graduation, he headed to Hilton Head where he served as the assistant superintendent at Daufuskie Island Golf Club where he had to take a boat to work each day, played a lot of golf, and caddied at Colleton River Country Club in Beaufort, and lived at Palmetto Dunes. His time there exposed him to many different course designers and their architectural styles, from Donald Ross to Jack Nicklaus to Arthur Hills, to the Maples brothers, to Rees and Robert Trent Jones and many others.

The mountains and family called him home in 2000 when he landed a job with Aspen Golf Division. His education was about to get serious. Reshaping greens, rebuilding and updating bunkers, building new tee boxes, irrigation and drainage projects, and general course renovation for Aspen gave him a resume' that would qualify him for a job at any prestigious golf course on the planet. In 2003 he was a vital part of the Aspen team that renovated the East Course at Oak Hill C.C. in Rochester, NY, for

the PGA championship. He's worked on projects throughout the southeast as well as here in WV at The Greenbrier, Guyan CC, Berry Hills CC, and Scarlet Oaks (now defunct). One of his most memorable experiences with Aspen was converting the toxic Mills Creek dump site in Erie, PA, into a golf course.


In 2010 Honaker was put in charge of all three courses here at Glade. He held that position until the "great schism" and today he is in a similar situation. His official title with the resort is director of golf and grounds, and he also serves the POA as a consultant who works with the course managers at Stonehaven and Woodhaven.

"I love my job," is something I've heard Keith Honaker say on more than one occasion. When pressed as to why, Glade's turf guru doesn't hesitate. "There are never two days alike. It's about solving problems, and I love figuring out how to solve those problems whether it is a drainage situation, or like last summer fighting drought, or in the office calculating how to get the most out of the monies that we have to spend to keep our courses in top shape."

When asked about the biggest challenge facing our courses, Honaker did not hesitate. "We've got to get people on our maintenance teams that care. If they don't take pride in their work and the condition of our courses, it makes it almost impossible to provide our golfers with the kind of quality course conditions they deserve."

I hope the readers of Glade Stroll appreciate what we have in our golf properties and the people who care for them. When it comes to balancing turf care and budgets, Glade residents are indeed fortunate to be in the good hands of Keith Honaker.

INGREDIENTS

- Nathan's Colossal 1/4 lb. 100% beef hot dogs. (Food Lion is the only store that has them)
- 3 or 4 poblano peppers sliced length wise.
- \bullet 1 medium onion sliced.



- 3 or 4 roma or vine tomatoes sliced length wise.
- 3 or 4 garlic cloves peeled.
- 4 cheese Mexican cheese.
- · Hoagie rolls.
- Extra lite virgin olive oil.
- Cast iron skillet, Blackstone or similar grill.





DIRECTIONS

- 1. Heat your cast iron skillet or Blackstone type device and add the olive oil.
- 2. Slice 4 or 5 slits in the hot dogs for cooking ease.
- 3. Cook the veggies and dogs until the veggies are soft and dogs have a nice char.
- 4. Toast the hoagie rolls in the oven or air fryer and add a layer of cheese on the bottom. Melt the cheese to your desired degree.
- 5. Add the hot dog and other goodies. ENJOY!


