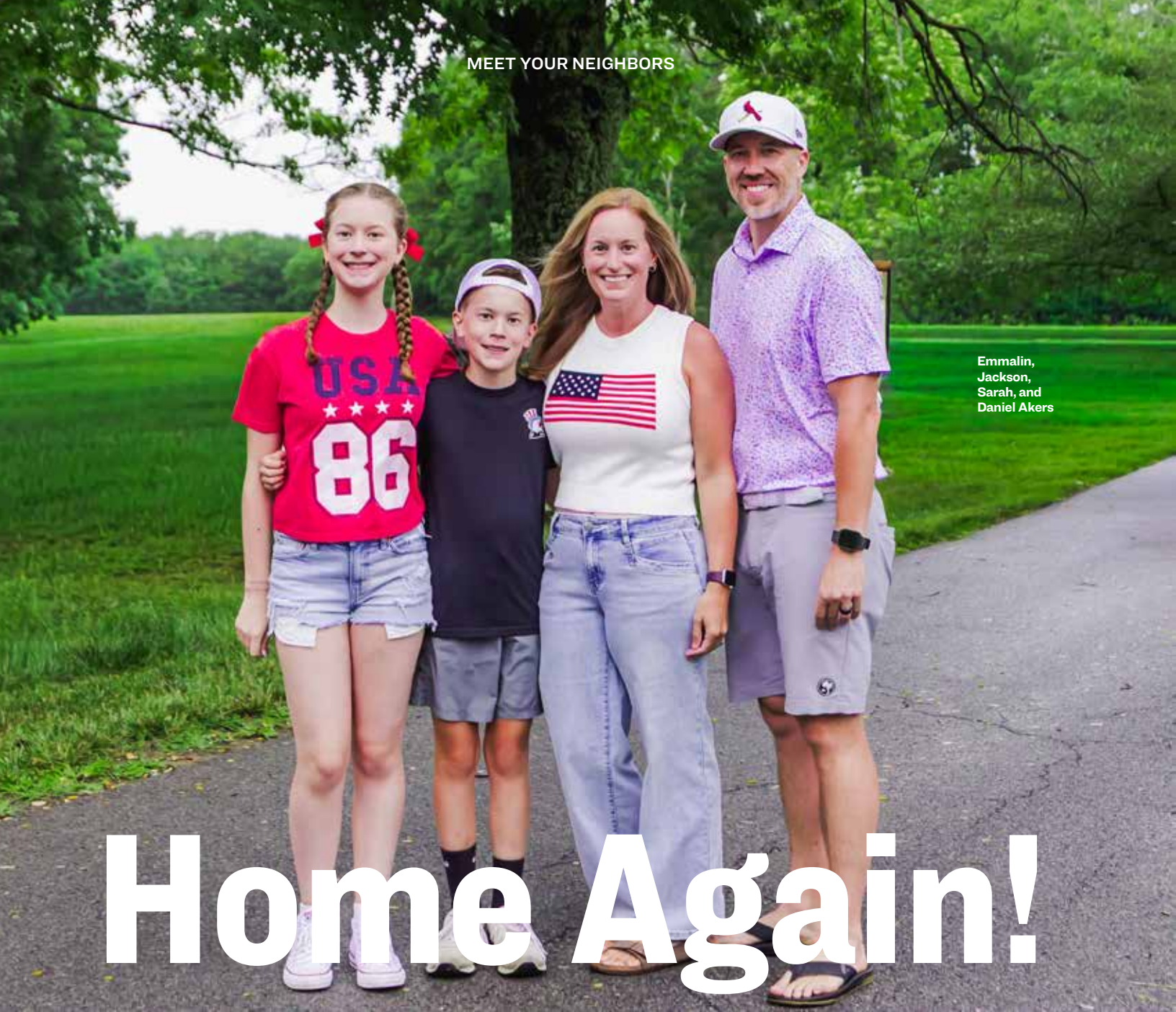

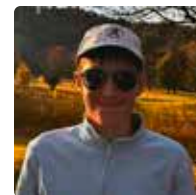

"We moved to Glade Springs because my parents live here," PJ said. "They're super involved with the kids."

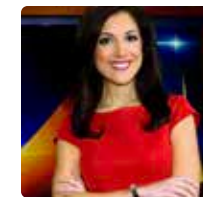

RESIDENT RECIPE

The Higinbotham Low Country Boil Recipe!

WE DISCOVERED THIS RECIPE several years ago from friends who live in Norfolk VA. It is a fun, wonderfully spicy meal with minimal prep with red potatoes, corn, sausage and shrimp. Now that we have Instapots, it has taken the guesswork out of pressure cooking! Biggest thing to remember is to trust the shrimp cooking time. You will be tempted to go longer, but don't! Pair this with flavored melted butter of your choice and make an impression by laying it all out on butcher paper for people to pick at!

INGREDIENTS:

- 1 ½ pounds of petite red potatoes (cut the big ones in 1/2)
- 2 packages of Andouille sausage cut into 2-3" pieces
- 3 ears of corn, cut into thirds
- 1 ½ pound fresh shrimp
- 1 can of beer
- 1 package of crab boil (I like Zatarain's)
- 1 teaspoon garlic powder
- 2 sticks butter melted (flavor with hot sauce, garlic if you like)
- 2 lemons
- 2 tablespoons Old Bay

PREPARATION:

1. Place potatoes, sausage and corn in pot. Pour in can of beer. Add 1 package of Zatarain's or ¼ cup of Old Bay if you can't find it and garlic powder.
2. Place lid, turn to seal and set to cook on High Pressure for 4 minutes.
3. When 4 minutes is done, do a quick release. Once pin drops, open the lid and place fresh shrimp and stir in. Add 1 tablespoon of Old Bay. Replace the lid and cook with the residual heat for 4-5 minutes.
4. When done, remove with a slotted spoon and place on butcher paper on counter or table. If desired sprinkle more Old Bay and squeeze lemons on top.
5. Place butter in small containers around the boil!
6. Enjoy!

Making the Invisible Visible!

Every rescue begins with someone who answers the phone. Sometimes it's about an abandoned puppy. Sometimes it's a frightened stray on the side of the road. Sometimes it's a family facing illness, domestic violence, or the loss of a loved one, desperately searching for someone to care for a cherished pet. When the phone rings at PupSavers Rescue, a West Virginia nonprofit animal rescue organization, someone answers.

One call came from a hospice nurse in New Mexico. A dying man had done everything he thought he could to protect his beloved dog, Roscoe. Before he passed away, he set aside substantial funds to ensure his nearly 100-pound companion would always be cared for. According to PupSavers, the person entrusted with both the money and Roscoe disappeared, leaving the dog in a high-kill shelter - not the future his owner had planned.

But the man's 76-year-old hospice nurse refused to let that promise be broken. Unable to keep Roscoe herself and facing eviction because of his size, she searched until she found PupSavers. Through an extraordinary network of volunteer drivers spanning nearly 30 transport stops, Roscoe made the journey from New Mexico to West Virginia, where he finally arrived safely.

Stories like Roscoe's are why PupSavers exists. There's a good chance you've already seen the happy ending. Several dogs rescued through PupSavers now live with families right here in Glade Springs. They're beloved companions today, but many once faced abandonment, neglect, overcrowded shelters, or uncertain futures.

For AJ Springfield, director of PupSavers, rescue is about far more than finding homes for dogs. "It's more crisis intervention for people. There's a crisis every minute." Every call represents someone who has run out of options - and a pet whose future depends on whether someone is willing to step in. Rescue often means helping both ends of the leash, providing hope for families while keeping beloved animals safe.

One woman dying of cancer spent her final days desperately searching for someone to care for her five elderly Chihuahuas. After calling organization after organization, she was told that euthanasia was their only option. PupSavers gave her a different answer: "We'll take care of your dogs."

Those words capture the heart of the rescue's mission. Its motto is Making the Invisible Visible—giving forgotten animals, and often the people who love them, hope when they have nowhere else to turn.

Today, about 10 dedicated volunteers care for roughly 30 dogs and puppies and an endless stream of intakes. They answer late-night phone calls, transport animals across the state, coordinate foster homes, raise money for veterinary care, and patiently help frightened dogs learn to trust again. Even after losing their Clarksburg facility to a fire last Thanksgiving, they never stopped rescuing animals.

Like many rescues across West Virginia, PupSavers is working in the middle of an unprecedented animal welfare crisis. Shelters are full, veterinary costs continue to rise, and there are simply more homeless animals than available homes. When shelters have reached capacity and can only say, "We're full," local rescues like PupSavers don't have the luxury of walking away. They begin finding creative solutions for animals that have run out of options. It is difficult, behind-the-scenes work that rarely makes headlines but saves lives every single day.

That's why supporting local rescues matters. National animal welfare organizations play an important role in advocacy and education, but local rescues are the ones putting those ideals into action. They work tirelessly to find safe foster and permanent homes and raise funds for emergency veterinary care, as they are unpaid volunteers who rely upon donations. They are the boots on the ground - the volunteers doing the difficult, often invisible work that saves lives every day.

As a nonprofit organization, PupSavers relies entirely on community support. One of its greatest needs right now is more volunteers in southern West Virginia, especially in the Beckley, Daniels, and Princeton areas. Foster families, transport volunteers, and people willing to give even a few hours of their time can literally save lives by helping one dog move to safety and making room for the next.

"You don't have to adopt to make a difference. Just keep a dog safe for a little while. You can save that dog's life."

Perhaps the greatest gift we can give organizations like PupSavers is recognizing that rescue isn't the responsibility of a handful of exhausted volunteers. It belongs to all of us. Because somewhere tonight another phone is ringing. Another family needs help. Another dog is waiting. And thanks to local rescues like PupSavers—and communities willing to stand beside them - someone will answer

The analog room is a response to digital overload. Does your home need one?

A GROWING NUMBER of homeowners are designating one room in their house for a single, radical purpose: no screens, no wifi, and no notifications. More than an interior design choice, the analog room is a contemporary twist on the sitting rooms of yesteryear. The soft surfaces remain, but there's not a television or radio in sight. These are dedicated spaces where books, board games, conversation, and quiet are the only things on the agenda.

According to GWI data compiled by DataReportal, the average American spends over seven hours a day in front of a screen. We've optimized our homes for connectivity via wifi, smart televisions, voice assistants, and more, and in doing so, quietly eliminated the conditions that make rest, creativity, and genuine

connection possible. An analog room pushes back.

To develop your own analog room, start with comfort as the guiding principle. Opt for deep, low seating and layer in textiles that invite you to linger, such as a cozy throw, a soft rug underfoot, and curtains heavy enough to muffle the outside world. Lighting should be warm and adjustable; select a floor lamp beside an armchair versus an overhead fixture.

Toss cozy floor pillows nearby, reach for lamps for illumination, light a candle, and keep puzzles and cards accessible. Most of all, make time to be in the space yourself or together as a family. It's the perfect place to model the behavior you hope to see in your home.

Hey, Dude

Dude ranches offer a rare digital detox wrapped in wide-open landscapes.

The dude ranch experience is quietly becoming the most meaningful family vacation of our time. Kids trade screen time for horseback riding; parents rediscover the joy of slowing down together, and even grandparents come along for the ride, participating in lawn games or studio art classes. There are early mornings, wholesome meals, and evenings under a sky full of stars, the location stripping away the noise of modern life in a way that no pool bar or theme park can. If you're ready to pack your bags and saddle up, September is an ideal time to visit. Summer crowds thin out, temperatures cool to a comfortable riding range, and the landscape shifts into its most dramatic autumn colors.

Cataloochee Ranch in North Carolina

Located just under an hour west of Asheville, this 92-year-old farm is the South's version of cowboy culture. Wednesday dinners are designed as a family meal where every type of smoked protein imaginable (including housemade sausage, river-caught fish, farm-raised beef) is served alongside sides made from the onsite garden's bounty. Guided horseback rides are held daily, as are

other activities such as leather stamping, archery, and fishing. Before checking out, head to the Mercantile's custom cowboy hat bar to design headwear fit for your personal style.

Paws Up Montana

Montana's most storied luxury dude ranch, Paws Up Montana, is a historic working cattle and bison property where Lewis and Clark-era legacy meets modern indulgence. Spread across 37,000 acres with over 100 miles of trails, the ranch offers 76 unique accommodations ranging from luxury homes to safari-style tents. Equestrian enthusiasts will find their home at The Saddle Club, Montana's premier private equestrian center, while Spa Town offers a quieter kind of adventure. On-demand shuttles and Lexus SUVs keep guests moving across the sprawling property in style. Best of all, nearly everything is included: gourmet meals daily, snacks and beverages, and even nightly fires built by your own Camp Butler, so the only thing left to do is decide what to do first.

Wildflower Farms in New York

Just 90 minutes from New York City in Gardiner, New York, Wildflower Farms

offers 140 acres of meadows and wild woodlands. A six-acre working farm anchors the property, home to Icelandic sheep, donkeys, and free-range chickens, with morning animal feedings open to guests looking for a calm, grounding start to the day. Beyond the farm, experiences range from falconry and hiking to Le Creuset cooking classes and whiskey tastings. Ranch life here looks a little different than it does out West, but the spirit is the same: land, rhythm, and a reason to slow down.

The Lodge at Blue Sky

Untamed Wasatch Mountain wilderness awaits here, where the ranch life runs deep. Horses and riding are part of its DNA. Beyond the saddle, the days fill easily with wildlife tracking, sporting clays, and, in winter, access to an exclusive ski lounge at the base of Park City Mountain Resort. The Edge Spa features an outdoor heated plunge pool and a relaxation lounge outfitted with locally made teas, while restaurant Yuta features a menu that changes with the seasons. Blue Sky makes a strong case that ranch life belongs in the mountains just as much as on the range.

MAKE & BAKE

Sweet Onion Dip

Store-bought is fine, but homemade is better.

Football season is back, as is the promise of tailgating... and all of the delicious food that comes with it. Whether you are planning to party under a tent with a full spread or keep it simple at home, this dip is sure to please any fan.

- INGREDIENTS:**
- 2 sweet onions (like Vidalia), finely diced
 - 2 tbsp butter
 - 8 oz cream cheese, softened
 - 1 cup sour cream
 - ½ cup mayonnaise
 - ½ tsp garlic powder
 - 1 tsp onion powder
 - ½ tsp salt
 - ¼ tsp black pepper
 - 2 tbsp fresh chives, chopped (for garnish)

STEP 1:
Start by caramelizing the onions in butter over medium-low heat, stirring occasionally until soft and golden. This process will take about 30 minutes. Don't rush it; that's where all the flavor comes from. Set aside and let cool for 10 minutes.

STEP 2:
In a large bowl, blend the cream cheese, sour cream, and mayonnaise until smooth. Fold in the cooled onions along with the garlic powder, onion powder, salt, and black pepper.

STEP 3:
Top with fresh chopped chives and serve with kettle chips, toasted baguette slices, or fresh vegetables. Present the dip slightly warm, or refrigerate it overnight for even more flavor.

IN LIVING COLOR

How does color theory impact our financial habits? More than you think.

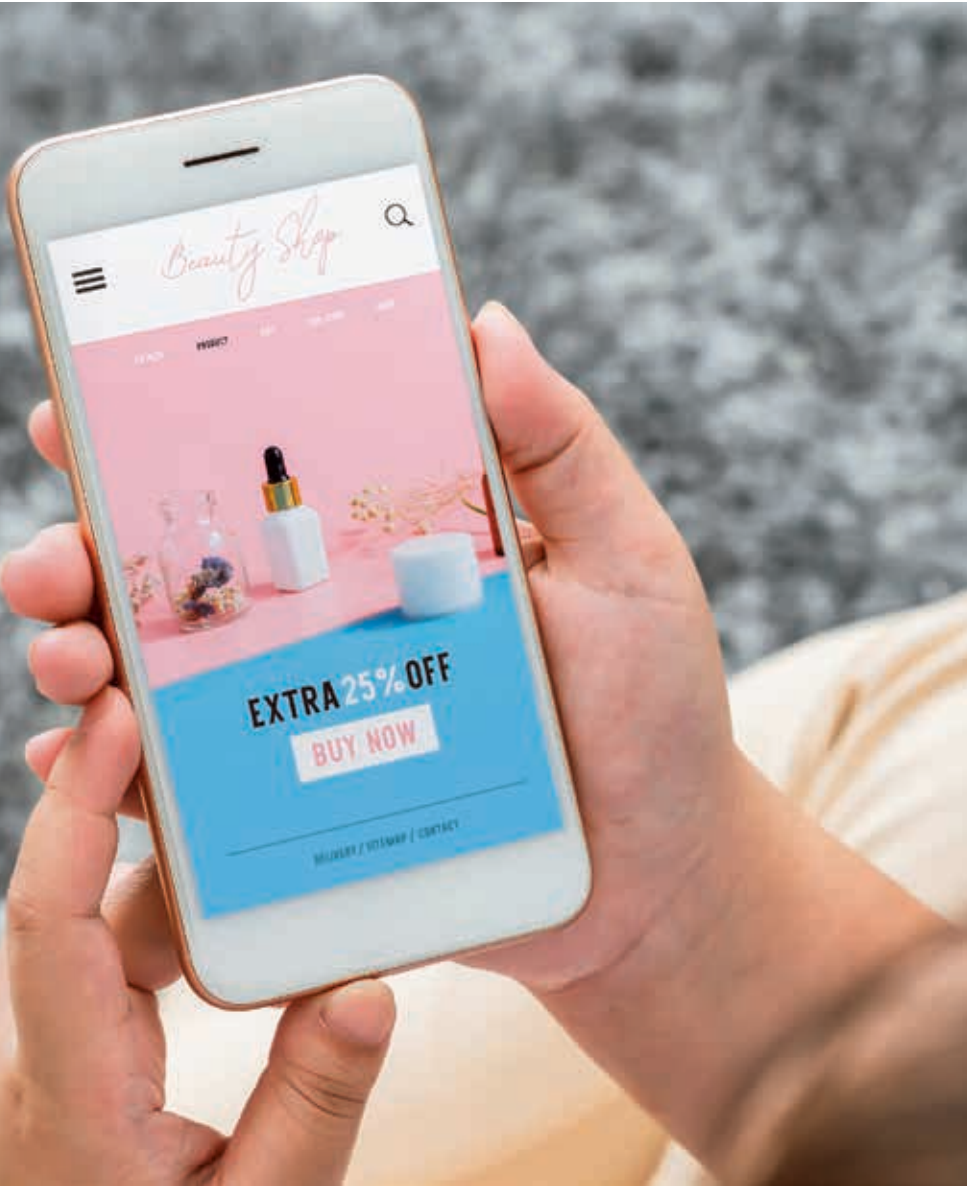

WHY FALL?

Fall is actually an ideal planting season. Cooler soil temperatures reduce transplant stress, and plants have time to establish roots before the ground freezes. The season also strips away some of summer's showiness, making texture, structure, and scent more noticeable, which is precisely what a sensory garden is designed to celebrate.

WHAT TO PLANT

For sound, Little Bluestem and Switchgrass are about as universal as ornamental grasses get, thriving across most of the country and catching even the lightest breeze with their feathery plumes. For scent, catmint and bee balm are both hardy, low-maintenance choices that release fragrance when brushed. For touch, lamb's ear has famously soft, velvety leaves. For taste, herbs are an obvious choice; chives and thyme are unfussy. And for sight, ornamental kale deepens in color as temperatures drop, making it visually interesting and ever-changing as the season continues.

In a season already inclined towards reflection, sensory gardens offer planters a place to slow down and take in their environment. You can start as simply as a pot of rosemary at your front door, or plant an entire space that captures every sense down to the smallest of details. The next time you are at your local nursery, choose plants that don't just look good; tap into all of your senses and select some that feel, smell, and even sound good too.

The Glue THAT BINDS

Junk journaling is emerging as a powerful wellness practice.

Thousands of people are gluing ticket stubs, tea bag wrappers, and torn magazine pages into handmade books and calling it self-care. More than a crafting hobby, junk journaling transforms everyday ephemera into deeply personal, tactile art, offering a screen-free creative outlet in a world starved for slowness. It borrows the nostalgic heart of scrapbooking but ditches the rules, inviting imperfection and spontaneity in a way that quietly trains the mind to be present.

What is a junk journal?

A junk journal is a place to fill and store repurposed, recycled, or found materials that speak to you. The process is less about the result and more about the creative practice of filling and decorating journal pages with items such as postage stamps, candy wrappers, paper napkins, fabric scraps, and other found keepsakes. Layering and collaging are welcome, and no writing is required, unless, of course, you want to write. The junk journaling world is your oyster. The emphasis is on using materials that have already lived a previous life, valuing texture and nostalgia over polish and perfection.

Why junk journal?

Traditional journaling can feel intimidating because it presents you with a blank page and, therefore, an expectation to produce something meaningful. For a lot of people, that pressure is enough to make them close the book, walk away, and never pick it up again. Junk journaling removes that pressure. The focus shifts from what you're thinking and feeling to what you're making, which creates an opportunity for reflection. You might find yourself processing something while arranging a collage without ever having to articulate it directly.

What is needed to get started?

Your journal can be as simple as a spiral notebook or legal pad, or as impressive as a leather-bound book. Once your vessel is selected, gather adhesive of choice (a glue stick for a simple look or washi tape for a more creative spin), scissors, a pen or markers for doodles or captions, and finally, your junk. Start with a small pile of collected items and see where the creativity takes you. The only rule is there are no rules; the messiest pages often hold the most meaning.
